


# 1837

Unlike his predecessors, Chief Keokuk of the Sauk tribe realized that violence against the white man's superior forces would result in the end of his people. Yet in negotiating with the US government, he found himself in a most difficult situation. Regardless of the outcome of these negotiations, the US was going to take lands that rightfully belonged to the Sauk and Fox. Chief Keokuk needed to secure what he could for his people. From a white man's perspective, it was skillful negotiations. From a Native American's perspective, it was negotiations mixed in with profiteering.








### 1931

**Mr. Jewett Fulton**, from Keokuk, Iowa - on the Mississippi, west of Chicago, - set out in December 1931 to send a message by letter to all non-English-speaking Rotary Clubs outside the United States, urging a worldwide symbolical smoking of the peace pipe.

























































TALLINNA ROTARY KLUBI

Dear Rotarian:-

I was much pleased to receive your letter dated 31st December last and if, owing to press of work, my answer has been delayed so long, I must ask your indulgence.

Your letter was read at one of our meetings and gave much satisfaction to all our members present, at the same time causing some amusement on account of the fact that it treats of a "pipe" and that my name in Estonian means pipe. In this connection I might further mention that I was a member of the delegation which signed the Treaty of Peace with Russia in 1920, so in a sense I smoked a Pipe of Peace on that occasion. Much as we should have liked to enter into the idea of your letter by smoking a real peace pipe this time, it was unfortunately not possible to procure one, so we followed your suggestion and smoked the pipe in spirit. We feel sure that such mutual attention among Rotary Clubs must further general understanding and the high ideals of Rotary to a considerable extent.


